When to refer to Interventional Radiology Clinic:

Patients with positive screening test (ABI <0.9) and lower extremity symptoms

Patients with claudication

Patients with lower extremity rest pain

Patients with non-healing, ischemic wounds, or risk of impaired wound healing post-op

Patients with symptomatic acute or chronic DVT

When to refer to Vein Treatment Center:

Patients with symptoms of venous insufficiency:

- · Lower extremity edema
- Varicose veins
- Superficial thrombophlebitis
- Venous stasis ulcers
